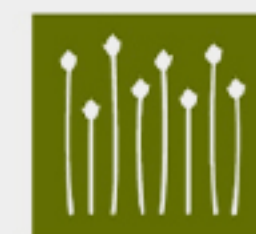

SA 8000 standard, published by SAI in 1997, addresses issues of Social Responsibility regarding worker conditions (human rights, development, empowerment, training and individual professional growth, worker health and safety, non-discrimination, child labor, and youth labor), and its requirements extend to suppliers and subcontractors throughout the entire supply chain.

SA 8000 was the first certifiable ethical standard, and compliance with it and its rigorous criteria is recognized worldwide. In practice, adhering to this certification involves the development and verification of management systems that promote socially acceptable work practices with benefits for both the organization and the entire supply chain.

To ensure transparency and prove our commitment to the environment, we were the first Italian textile company to strive for the most relevant certification in the industry: ISO 14001. This voluntary step attests to our constant dedication to reducing pollution, waste production, and consumption of energy and materials.

ISO 14001 is part of a series of international standards concerning Environmental Management Systems that are applicable to all types of organizations. It is the most widely adopted Environmental Management Systems standard in the world, and its management system includes planning, execution, control, and improvement actions.

The application of the ISO 14001 standard defines the most important requirements for identifying, controlling, and monitoring the environmental aspects of any organization with an environmental policy.

European Flax® is a certification that guarantees the traceability of superior quality linen fiber grown in Western Europe (France, Belgium, Netherlands). A plant fiber, cultivated without irrigation (99.9% guaranteed by CELC) and without GMOs.



European Flax® aims to meet consumer expectations by highlighting the social and environmental sustainability of linen, a natural, local, and traceable fiber that is innovative and high-performing. European Flax® is a registered trademark owned by the European Confederation of Linen and Hemp (CELC).



The OCS certification guarantees the use of natural fibers (cotton, linen, hemp, etc.) cultivated according to the principles of organic farming, meaning without the use of synthetic chemical pesticides and Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs).

All products that are composed of at least 5% certified organic natural fibers can be certified as organic textiles.



The GOTS certification has been developed by leading international organizations in organic agriculture to ensure that organic textile products are made in compliance with rigorous environmental and social criteria applied at all levels of production, from the harvesting of natural fibers in the fields to the subsequent processing, all the way to the labeling of the finished product.



GRS cottons are fabrics made from both pre-consumer and post-consumer recycled fibers. The certification imposes restrictions on the use of chemicals and compliance with a wide range of environmental criteria, such as water resource utilization, waste management, energy consumption, atmospheric pollutants, etc. It also sets strict social criteria for workers' rights.

The BCI exists to make global cotton production better for the people who produce it, better for the environment in which it grows, and better for the future of the industry. The Better Cotton Standard System is a holistic approach to sustainable cotton production that covers all three pillars of sustainability: environmental, social, and economic.

Each element – from the Principles and Criteria to the monitoring mechanisms that show results – works in synergy to support the Better Cotton Standard System and the BCI's credibility. The system is designed to ensure the sharing of good practices and to encourage stronger collective action.



MASTERS OF LINEN® is a label that encompasses European textile companies, spinners, and brands involved in a system of strict traceability for linen that is 100% cultivated and processed on European soil, ensuring its quality in order to support this European industry. The label, issued by the CELC (The European Confederation of Flax and Hemp), certifies linen by tracing it throughout every stage of the supply chain: from fiber cultivation, yarn production, and fabric composition to the packaging of the finished product.
